


CAL AGGIE ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

DIRECTOR'S LETTER

Greetings, CAMBAA!

It's now been a bit more than a year since I joined the Cal Aggie Marching Band-Uh!, and I'm pleased to provide an update as the newest Director of the band. From the wackiness of Pajamarino to the roar of the Pavilion for basketball, and then sharing the streets for Picnic Day, it's been an honor and pleasure to meet so many of you all. I wanted to spend just a few moments to share some updates about what we've got going on on our side of the street in Davis.

Times are constantly changing for our bandsmen, and it brings me much excitement to share that we've really gone to bat with campus officials to get the proper care for our instruments and equipment. Around August of 2017, I brought in the Executive Director of Campus Recreation, Unions, and Stores to our facilities to show what they often miss. While the Band-Uh! members always march high and "yo" loud, many of their instruments date back as far as the 50s. The act of doing this, brought us a \$60,000 replacement project last year where we brought in piccolos, sousies, everything in-between, and even glocks. I feel it is important to mention that our continued efforts as a band, and gaining exposure across the state has allowed us to secure an additional \$70,000 for instrument replacement during the 2018-2019 fiscal year. At the end of the day it's really about the hard-work, dedication, and camaraderie that allows our students to be the best in the land. I'm thinking a new set of just bass saxophones is in need? (I'm mostly kidding) We have also partnered up with the UC Davis Stores for a whole new array of CAMB designs in-stores and online. I'm grateful for the support from our administrators recently, and be sure to look out for details about our brand new uniform replacement campaign in the coming months.

The band recently welcomed a HUGE class of freshman, and I'm excited that with them comes the new coordinator as well. Anthony Panebianco joined the Cal Aggie Marching Band-Uh! as coordinator on the 17th of September. I'm excited for his passion, innovative ideas, and really to finally have a "band kid." After joining up with you all on October 13th for the Homecoming game and then travelling on to another football victory at Cal Poly, we will be returning to Oakland for the FINAL time this year. We will be playing the halftime show for the game on October 28th versus the Indianapolis Colts during the Raiders final season in their current location. Cheer loud if you're there, and don't forget that we'll be tailgating prior to the 1PM kickoff! Another big update comes in the form of the exciting news that the UCD Band Day will be returning on the 3rd of November against Northern Arizona. We will be bringing 10 high school bands to our stadium, and all 600 students(+) will be joining us on the field for a wall of sound. You don't want to miss out!

I want to give a huge "thank you" to CAMBAA for providing lunch for us at retreat once again this year. It feels terrific knowing that we have a whole crew in our corner at the end of every band event. While the Rec Pool and half of the ARC have been closed for the past few months, the Band-Uh! has continued to play strong. We've got some more surprises up our sleeves, but it wouldn't truly be fair to spoil them all in this letter. I'm honored to share many of your old traditions with the bandsmen, and I look forward to continuing to make history with this new era of Aggies.



Alumni Feature: Joe "tfw freshman like 'did you say a *hyper* drill?'" Hiber, Baritone, and Drum Major '74

Just mouth along until you learn the words

While completing a degree in Agricultural Economics and Business Management in the 70s, Joe played the baritone (among other instruments) in the Band-uh and served as drum major in 1974. His studies often took him to the library, where he explored the band's history through archived yearbooks.

After learning that "all [you] had to say was that a behaviour was a 'Tradition' ...whether or not we had done it before," Joe introduced music from the archives into the band's repertoire - lyrics for Aggie Fight, Alma Mater, Toast to California, and I Love You California (the California state song).

You want what?

As drum major, Joe once requested a 25-yard keyboard for a halftime show. John Kleinschmidt, the stunts committee chairperson, had a 17-yard one made out of bed sheets instead.

[At retreat,] the drum major would practice "ups" with the band. Drills like this gave us opportunity to scrutinize each member for uniformity to our fast-paced style, and members to point their toes. [...] The band had to be conditioned to meet the stamina required of a full halftime show.

Upon his graduation, the band decided to maintain the memory of Joe's dedication to discipline and resilience by renaming the "ups" as "Hiber Drills" ...leading to the establishment of a unique and distinctly Band-uh incentive / consequence / acquired fear.
